Early Drop Off/After Camp Care

Mrs. Baker will be providing service for families who need before/after camp care starting at 8:00am and until 5:00pm Cost will be \$5 daily for each morning or afternoon session per child

Arts and Crafts (ages 6-14)

July 10th - 14th: 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. Instructor: Mrs. Baker - \$25 materials fee Minimum 4 and Maximum 16 campers

Tie-dying shirts, squirt gun painting, and many other fun and exciting arts and crafts will take place in this camp. We will use recycled items, paint, yarn, and other mediums. Students will enjoy a variety of different types of crafts. We will be all hands on and students should plan on getting dirty and having fun!

Astronomy Camp (rising 4th grade and up)
